"St Wystan's Church is a unique witness to the Christian conversion of Mercia and its crypt one of the most complete and atmospheric spaces to have survived from Anglo-Saxon England. I urge you to support the Friends in their efforts to help conserve and enhance this remarkable building."

Why St Wystan's is a special place

Christianity was first brought to Repton by missionaries from Northumbria in 653-4. The earliest church building was constructed around 675. Christian worship has carried on here ever since.

Important features include:

- The crypt dating from the early 700s which was the burial place of the Mercian royal family.
- The 212ft spire which dominates the local landscape.
- The 15th century oak ceiling which has fine elaborately carved bosses.
- Alabaster monuments including a 15th century tomb and 16th century memorial slab
- A fine ring of eight bells, the oldest dating from the 16th century.
- The 1998 organ by Peter Collins.

The interior layout dates from the restoration by Sir Arthur Blomfield in 1885-6. The west end was re-ordered in 2009-10 when a kitchen and toilets were installed.

The dedication to St Wystan arises from the murder of a prince from the Mercian royal family, who was interred in the crypt in 849.
